Winners of the 2010 Africa investor Infrastructure Investment Awards announced at Ai Projects Summit

London, Beijing, Johannesburg, Nairobi, Casablanca, Lagos; 21 October 2010: Africa investor (Ai), a leading international investment research and communications group, tonight announced the winners of the 2010 Africa investor Investment Awards at a ceremony during the Ai Infrastructure Projects Summit in Johannesburg, South Africa.

In the first category, the Developer of the Year award went to Copperbelt Energy Corporation for their various developments across the continent. Power Deal of the Year went to Nampower and Zimbabwean Electricity Supply Authority (ZESA) for their work with the Hwange Power Plant. Transport Deal of the Year was awarded to the National Ports Authority for the Kribi Deepwater Port in Cameroon. The ICT/Telecoms of the Year award was presented to the International Finance Corporation (IFC), African Development Bank (AfDB), KFW of Germany and the Agence Française de Développement (AFD) for their exceptional work on the East African Submarine Cable System (EASSy), while Water Deal of the Year was awarded to the Rand Merchant Bank for their work with the eThekwini Municipality.

Social Infrastructure Deal of the Year was awarded to Futuregrowth and NURCHA for their work on the NURCHA housing and community projects while, in an interesting twist, Oil and Gas Deal of the Year was jointly awarded to Bowman Gilfillan for overseeing the Ibhubesi Gas Field, and Citadel Capital for their work with the Egypt Refining Company. Judges were undecided and so it was awarded to both. PPP Champion of the Year was presented to the Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) Infrastructure Concession Regulatory Commission (ICRC), while Infrastructure Fund of the Year deservedly went to Harith for its Pan African Infrastructure Development Fund. Infrastructure Regulator of the Year was awarded to the Railway Safety Regulator, SARA, for the exceptional Trans-Kalahari Rail Line project in Botswana.

Sponsor of the Year was presented to Dangote Group in recognition of the various projects they have sponsored across the continent, and Bank Arranger of the Year was awarded to Stanbic IBTC for their work in the Oando Plc refinancing scheme. Legal Advisor of the Year award was given to Bell Dewar for the Independent Power Peaking Project, Central African Gold Ghana Ltd, while Advisor of the Year went to Fieldstone for the Tema Osonor Plant. Regional Project of the Year was given to the Development Bank of Southern Africa for the outstanding Kasumbalesa Border Post Project, and Construction Company of the Year award was given to the Bombela Concession Company for its various construction projects. Finally, Infrastructure Personality of the Year was presented to the Honourable Minister for Transport, South Africa, Sibusiso Ndebele.
